



Better care closer to home

The third JTC addresses the need to improve the **enhancement of primary** and community care, provide **policy and decision makers** with the necessary **knowledge and tools** to govern the transitions needed in these sectors.

The ultimate goal is to improve **health and care system** dimensions such as **quality, efficiency, equity,** and **sustainability.**





Rationale of the call

- Appropriate settings for care delivery to best serve users and caretakers.
- New or improved health and care models needed to rethink delivery, organization, financing, and distribution.
- Current Reliance on Institutional Care
 - Over-reliance on hospitals and other institutional care.
 - High personnel and cost barriers to meeting future demand.
 - Applies to hospitals, care homes, and mental health institutions.
- Barriers to Non-Institutionalised Care
 - Infrastructure and resource capacity.
 - Adequate funding and reimbursement models.
 - Policy and legislative obstacles.





Aim of the call

- Enable reduced reliance on institutionalised treatment.
- Service innovations that promote the transformation of the health and care system.

Sub-topic 1: Strengthening the primary and community health and care system

 Proposals may concern 1) organisational innovations,2) operational improvements, or 3) human resource innovations.

Sub-topic 2: Systemic approaches to modernising the primary and community care sector

- Actionable and applicable knowledge
- Policy development, change management, strategic planning



Proposals will be rejected if they...

- 1) Predominantly concern development of new technological solutions (TRLs 1-3), without any focus on the integration of solutions, organisational models or implementation in the health and care systems.
- 2) Have a predominantly clinical, pre-clinical/bio-medical component.
- 3) Are solely epidemiological studies mapping the extent of and causal factors of illnesses, without a focus on solutions, models or implementation in health and care systems.
- 4) Relate solely to welfare services and do not address issues related to health and care services.
- 5) Do not take into consideration an ecosystem-wide approach*
- 6) Fail to consider end-users' perspective*
- * See Guidance for Applicants for details





Essential elements

- Collaborative, transnational research, innovation, and assessment actions are required.
- Projects must include one or more of the following: applied research, implementation research, piloting, upscaling, and/or testing.
- All projects must show proof of concept, validate solutions, and demonstrate them in relevant health and care settings. Translating existing solutions to new settings is also included.
- Proposals involving technology development or organizational models related to new technologies must target Technology Readiness Levels (TRLs) 4 to 8.
- Projects must be original and can build on, but not duplicate, existing EU-funded activities (e.g., Joint Action CIRCE-JA).



Submission and Evaluation Procedure







Call procedures and criteria

- Project duration: 12 to 36 months
- Applicants:
 - Academia
 - Clinical/public health sector
 - Companies
 - Operational stakeholders
- Min. 3 eligible partners from 3 different countries (at least 2 EU Member States or Associated Countries)
- Max. 9 eligible partners
- Max. 2 eligible partners from the same country
- The project coordinator must be eligible for funding
- Max. 2 collaborators (self-funded partners)
- A proposal can be rejected if one of partners appears to be non eligible
- Principal investigators can submit up to 2 proposals
- Principal investigators can submit only <u>1 proposal as coordinator</u> (+ 1 as a partner)
- Additional documentation might be required nationally/regionally
 - →Applicants are strongly encouraged to contact their national/regional contact points to check their national/regional eligibility rules before submission





Eligible Costs

- Personnel
- Consumables
- Equipment
- Travel
- Other Direct Costs
- Subcontracting
- Overheads

Project partners must refer and adhere to their own regional/national regulations (Call text - Annex 1)





Enterprises participation

European regulations prohibit Funding Organisations from granting aid to enterprises in difficulty.

Therefore, Funding Organisations will conduct checks to ensure that your enterprise is not in difficulty.

This process could take time. Please contact your Funding Organisation as early as possible.



Double funding is not allowed





Key Considerations for Successful Proposals

- Emphasis on multidisciplinary teams and intersectoral collaboration.
- Development of sustainability strategies (legal, financial, technological, educational).
- Inclusion of diverse stakeholders: health professionals, system owners, service users.
- Integration with broader ecosystems to ensure impactful and sustainable solutions.
- Focus on interdisciplinary research: clinical, public health, digital health, ethical, economic, and user-centered perspectives.
- Inclusion of sex, gender analysis and underrepresented populations






